Wandsworth Common Nature Centre

Wandsworth Common's Nature Centre is located within 73 hectares of green space in Wandsworth Common. The Centre is run by NatureScope, a consortium of organisations which includes Groundwork, All Star Tennis, Thrive and Wandsworth Council.

Wandsworth Common has a variety of habitats, including woodland, meadow, ponds, leaf litter, logs, and hedgerow, which allow children to discover a variety of different animals, plants, and lifecycles. The wooden Swiss-style chalet on site houses toilets and a teaching resource capable of accommodating up to 30 children at a time. There is also a further pond, food-growing beds, and a new nature trail within the Centre's garden.

What the Nature Centre Offers

- Hire and use of indoor facility at Centre and nature garden, including access to toilets and Centre pond
- Pre-prepared curriculum-based lesson plans and resources
- Use of materials and tools such as pond dipping nets
- Permission to use the Common for education purposes from Wandsworth Council

Sessions available

The Education Programme caters for Nursery groups and Foundation classes through to Year 2, and supports Science & PSHE/Citizenship schemes of work.

Self-led or NatureScope-led

Foundation & Reception:	Minibeasts. Pond Dipping.
KS1:	Minibeasts. Pond Dipping.
KS2:	Lifecycles.

NatureScope-led only

KS1:	Trees & Plants, which covers seasons and animals.

The benefits of the Nature Centre

It is recognised that there is much less scope for school trips if National Curriculum requirements are to be met. It is also increasingly difficult for teachers to find the time to arrange trips.

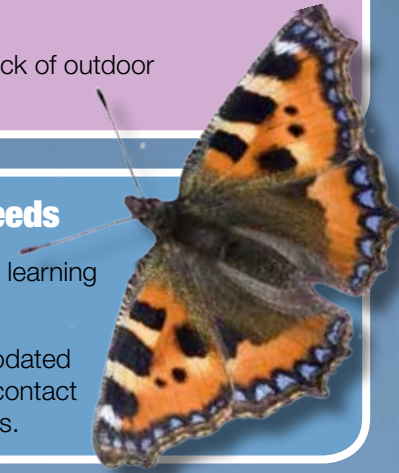
However, children experience a more valuable and memorable learning experience if they have direct contact with nature and make discoveries for themselves in new and exciting surroundings.

Accommodating children with special needs

We can run special sessions for groups of children with learning disabilities or mental health problems.
